PE days remain the same for this term and are as follows:



Mobile Phones

We recommend that pupils do not bring mobile phones to school. We appreciate that at times older pupils may require them for after school communication. Should your child bring their phone to school they must be named and handed into the school office during registration for safe keeping. Please note the school cannot accept any responsibility for the loss or damage of mobile phones.

Attendance Matters Month

January is our Attendance Matters Month. This month the Senior Leadership Team will be reviewing attendance of all children and will be identifying those who are a cause for concern. We will be monitoring attendance closely this month to look for improvements.

Regular attendance is a contributory factor to pupils reaching their potential in school and helps to promote a sense of 'belonging' within a class and social group.

We monitor attendance on a weekly basis and those children whose attendance falls below 90% becomes a cause for concern.

90% Attendance is roughly the equivalent of:
½ a day off per week,
19 days off per year,
247 days off over a school career of 13 academic years,

Which is equivalent to over I year lost education Consider what this equates to for 80% and 70% attendance.



Morning Drop Off

A reminder that our playground is supervised from 8:35am in the morning. Children should not arrive before then unless attending breakfast club or wake and shake. During wet weather we would recommend that children arrive as close to the bell as possible and make their way to their entrance door.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club is on every morning from 8.00am to 8.35am and costs £1 per day parents Please ensure you book your child in on ParentPay at least 24 hours in advance and for a Monday before 9.00am the Friday before.

Rights Respecting School Award

The Unicef UK Rights Respecting Schools Award (RRSA) supports schools across the UK to embed children's human rights in their ethos and culture. There are 42 separate rights known as Articles. The award recognises achievement in putting the UN Convention on the Right of the Child (UNCRC) at the heart of a school's practice to improve well-being and help all children realise their potential.

We are delighted that we have successfully achieved out Bronze Award for our rightsrespecting work. Over the course of this academic year we will be working towards achieving our Silver Award status. This will mean we will be working to uphold the UNICEF values, based on the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC).

We are very proud of the very positive and encouraging ethos of our school. The pupils, staff and parents feel that the school is a welcoming and supportive environment for all and we aim to continue to build on this through our work as a Rights Respecting School.
