Nurture

At the heart of our approach to positive relationships is our underlying whole school approach to Nurture. As a nurturing school, we recognise that positive relationships are central to both learning and wellbeing. All educational settings in Scottish Borders are implementing nurturing approaches. Schools' and settings' core values will ensure that there is an increasing emphasis on positive relationships as well as learning. This involves everyone.

A nurturing approach has a key focus on our school environment and emphasises the balance between care and challenge, which incorporates warmth and connection alongside structure, high expectations and a focus on achievement and attainment. It is based on the understanding of 6 Nurturing Principles, which have been adapted and are outlined below:

- 1. Children's learning is understood developmentally
- 2. The environment offers a safe base
- 3. The importance of nurture for the development of wellbeing
- 4. Language is a vital means of communication
- 5. All behaviour is communication
- 6. Transitions are important in children and young people's lives
