



Literacy

In literacy we will be looking at Scottish fables as a part of our narrative topic. We shall then move on to information reports linking these with our voyage of discovery. We are now looking at informing as opposed to persuading our readers. Again, we will be focusing on up-levelling our work through word choice, extended sentences and higher-level punctuation. This will also tie into our listening and talking lessons.

In reading we are engaging with a range of different texts to develop the children's love of reading while making connections and reflecting on the ideas within the text.

Numeracy & Mathematics

Order of Operation

- Having explored the need for rules for the order of operations in number calculations.
- Explain and justify my strategy when using multi-step problems
- Use the correct mathematical vocabulary.

Angles

- Describe and classify angles in the environment
- Accurately measure and draw angles
- Develop understanding of the link between compass points and angles allowing for the following of directions, routes and journeys

Data Handling

- Discuss the ways to present data, interpret and draw conclusions from the information displayed
- Recognise that data may be misleading

Health & Wellbeing

This term we will continue to look at the development of our bodies and the reproductive system.

In P.E. the children will be working on: **Cross Country**

Pacing themselves over 15 minutes, covering as great a distance as they can.

Perseverance and determination.
Taking their pulse before and after their run. How exercise affects their heart rate.

Pickleball
Forehand, Backhand, Groundstrokes, Volley.

Rules and scoring – similarities and differences between Tennis and Pickleball.
Teamwork and Doubles Tactics.

Voyage of Discovery

This term we will explore various environmental and geographical topics, focusing on the impact of human activities on the environment and ways to live more sustainably and responsibly. The children will consider the advantages and disadvantages of different transport options, particularly regarding their environmental effects, and discuss sustainable travel solutions like electric cars and solar panel-powered vehicles. Pupils will also investigate land use developments, weighing their potential impacts on local communities. We will create a travel brochure using the information they gather.

Additionally, pupils will develop their orienteering skills, expand their mental maps, and gain a deeper understanding of the places they live, work, and visit.
